Bylaws

Article I-Name, Purpose

Section 1: Peace on the streets is an organization created to be a nonprofit group.

Section 2: Peace on the street was created to provide creative alternative activities for teens and young adults through arts, entertainment and sports during the summer months where many of the problems of this city arise. P.O.T.S. will create events that will promote community involvement, cultural awareness and practicing peace.

Article II-Membership

Section 1: Application for voting membership shall be open to any nonprofit organization that support the purpose statement in article I, section II and continuing membership is contingent upon being up to date on membership dues as well as comply with all the rules, guidelines established by laws governing nonprofits and those instated by the Broad of Directors. Membership pool will consists of finance contributors, nonprofit organization and sponsors. The future Broad will be comprised of x-program participates who have successfully completed the mission and qualified themselves to hold office, run departments and have a seat on the broad.

Section 2: Membership shall be granted upon a majority vote of the Broad and the founder of P.O.T.S here now referred to as S.L.W. The Board of Directors shall have the right to deny, or terminate, the membership of any organization with the consent of S.L.W.
